2022 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

School Doors Open and Child Aid Bolsters Student Learning

Most schools across Guatemala opened in 2022, and Child Aid's most urgent mission became clear: Help teachers make the most of their time with students. Educators told us that catching kids up after most kids missed several years worth of schooling due to the pandemic was their chief concern, and we heard them. Our efforts to help educators included an expansion into a needful place, the department of Quiché; resuming our annual book deliveries; growing our educational offerings for girls; expansion of our popular educational radio broadcasts; fine-tuning our award-winning literacy program to help educators assess children quickly and helping educators manage small-group learning in their classrooms. We also continued our much-needed emergency food relief efforts.



Meeting the Needs of a New Place: Quiché

Child Aid began an expansion of our literacy program into Quiché, a fourth department (state), due to a generous \$200,000 grant from the Tinker Foundation. Quiché is one of the most poverty stricken areas of the world, and it's also home to mostly indigenous people. The need for our strong, award-winning education program is great in this department, and with funding from the Tinker Foundation, we secured and opened our fourth Child Aid office and hired staff. Our goals in Quiché include:

Early in 2022, Child Aid doubled down on our commitment to bolstering girls' educational opportunities by developing and leading a five-week intensive literacy program for indigenous girls at the Maia School. Our literacy trainers took students through in-depth reading, writing and comprehension exercises, and we continued to train educators at the Maia School throughout the year. Additionally, Child Aid expanded our popular educational radio broadcasts into all four departments (states) where we work. Begun during the pandemic, these lively shows urge children to read along and call into the show with answers to educational questions. Thousands of students access these broadcasts, and they are enormously popular with children and parents alike.

CHILDREN MEALS IN FOOD AID

Child Aid Delivers Books and Emergency Food

As school doors re-opened across the nation, children in Child Aid schools were greeted with new books! In late February and March, more than 20,000 elementary-age children in Guatemala gained access to new high-quality, Spanish-language books when our book delivery efforts stocked school shelves with 48,000 books in 107 schools across four departments (states) in Guatemala. These books were sorely needed after the pandemic had closed schools and stalled our book provision efforts in 2021.

Our organization also continued meeting an unprecedented hunger crisis with more emergency food assistance. Made possible through generous funding from Christadelphian Meal-A-Day, we distributed another round of 2,000 food boxes to the children and families in the communities we serve. To date, our organization has delivered nearly 3 million meals to hungry people in Guatemala.





“Many people get into international nonprofit work because they are romanced by the culture,” Press writes in her winning essay. “They think they’ll understand it one day, but they never will fully. That’s why Child Aid approaches our work in Guatemala with humility, respect and strong investment in local leadership. And we always expect to be surprised.”

In June 2022, after nearly two years away due to pandemic-related travel restrictions, Child Aid CEO Dr. Nancy Press returned to Guatemala to see, firsthand, how Guatemalan schools were faring after the long closures. Press visited classrooms and school libraries, as well as our four Child Aid offices and the studios from which we broadcast our educational radio programming. While she was glad to see schools open and students raising their hands in classes, she remains deeply concerned at the toll the school closures took on children who already struggle with fewer resources, especially female students who are often pressured to leave school in the early grades to work or provide childcare. Press was bolstered, however, by our organization’s quick pivot to help teachers employ remedial learning strategies. She was impressed by Child Aid’s continued use of online technologies such as Zoom and WhatsApp to deliver to teachers easily digestible and shareable educational materials.

In August, Dr. Press was honored by AARP’s award-winning digital newsletter, *The Girlfriend*, when she was recognized for her career leadership with Child Aid. The honor highlights how her doctoral work in anthropology helps her lead an organization rooted in ancient Maya culture.

This year was a pivotal year in the history of Child Aid. Following a global crisis, we found educators needed our help more than ever to address the challenges of students returning to school with large deficits in their learning. Our program dug deep and proved nimble enough to meet the training needs of teachers. Drawing from our deep bench of indigenous local leadership, our organization responded to on-the-ground needs for books, emergency food provisions, as well as educational opportunities for the most vulnerable among us.
